## SU Compliance

Some surveys may be considered human subject research and require [Institutional Review Board \(IRB\) approval](#) prior to the initiation of the survey. In general, if your survey data is only being collected for a class project, quality improvement project, departmental evaluation, or social use, IRB approval may not be needed. However, if this survey is for a research project (1) involving a systematic investigation with (2) the goal of creating generalized knowledge (i.e., being able to apply the data to a broader population and plan to publish or present the findings), IRB approval may be required. FERPA and HIPPA compliance should also be observed.
